Zambia – An agricultural economy 20.4% GDP





Agricultural Exports -Zambia





Quick facts – Agriculture in Zambia

Small-scale farmers (0-5ha)

 subsistence producers of staple foods with occasional marketable surplus.

Medium-scale farmers (5-0ha)

 corn and a few other cash crops for the market.

Large-scale farmers (>50ha)

 various crops for the local and export markets.

Cassava, wheat, ground nuts, cotton, tobacco, sorghum, coffee, rice, sugar.


Livestock

Rural areas - 80% own at least one chicken goats, cattle and pigs.

- Fluctuating market prices



General Challenges

- Low income ≤ \$15,000 annual income due to high unemployment rates – 13.3% (2014)
 - Leaves little resources to invest in agriculture.
- Increase in pest incursions





General Challenges

- Market access issues
 - Limited enforcement of policies promoting local products.
 - "Complacency" in meeting quality & SPS standards – seen as a cost and not an investment

Opportunities – Public and Private Sector

- Government support- through Ministry of Agriculture Priority sector for government
- Zambia Agricultural Research Institute shaping Zambian agriculture through research programs -new varieties, pest management strategies
- PQPS services to prevent introduction and spread of plant pests and facilitate local and international agro trade.
- Ease of doing agribusiness -2017, 2016, 2015. Registration of Businesses



- Eco-friendly agro-service company
- Supplies IPM Products to small scale farmers
 - Provides market access for small scale farmers to local markets


